



*Always look at your product's care tag before washing any item for the first time.*

## W A S H I N G



Always use cold water and the "gentle" cycle when washing linens.



Any wool or silk products cannot be machine washed. Dry clean only.



Use a mild detergent. Domani recommends L'Avant Laundry Detergent for premium linens. Other recommended detergents include Ivory Snow, Dreft, or any clear detergent. Do not use any brighteners or fabric softeners as these can damage cotton fibers.



To brighten white linens or towels, never use bleach. While bleach will help maintain a white color, it is also very harsh and wears out soft materials very quickly. Rather, vinegar will accomplish what bleach does, without affecting the soft feel of your linens or towels. To use, add 1 cup distilled white vinegar to the wash load in the fabric softener slot, alongside the detergent.

## D R Y I N G



Yes! You can use the dryer. Tumble dry on low heat. Do not overdry. It is best to remove from dryer while still slightly damp. Do not let the linens sit in the dryer, but rather remove immediately to prevent wrinkling. Do not use a dryer sheet.

## I R O N I N G



You can use a warm iron on all fabrics. Iron while slightly damp. Or, if linens are completely dry, use the "steam iron" setting. For an extra smooth look and to get rid of wrinkles more quickly when ironing, use a sizing spray, do not use starch. Sizing spray will add body to your fabric without the stiffening that starch causes.



Use a wrinkle releaser spray. This can be done while the linens are draped, or even using a spritz bottle of water once the bed is made, as instructed in this post.



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Never ever wash white towels with towels of another color! Even one colored towel can bleed, causing white towels to go from bright white to slightly off. Wash towels separate from other items, particularly garments with buttons, zippers, hooks, and velcro.



Wash towels using medium heat. Don't overload the machine!



Do not use bleach or fabric softeners. Also be careful using too much detergent. While, obviously, too little detergent will leave towels dirty, when there's too much, it may not all get rinsed out, leaving towels not as-soft-as-they-can-be. For colored towels: Don't use detergents that include brightener or whitening agents which can alter or fade colors.



If a towel has a pull, don't pull it. Simply snip it off using scissors to pile height.



Always tumble dry towels thoroughly on medium heat until completely dry and fluffy. Never hang dry or remove from the dryer while still slightly damp! The dryer restores plushness and loft to the towels.
