My Very Own Interactive Ke'arah

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Grade Level: Early Childhood

Description:

An interactive Seder plate that will help your preschool-aged child feel involved in the seder! This ke'arah is easy to make and requires only simple materials. Children match the parts of the seder plate and then attach them with Velcro, so they can be used again and again. Three matzos underneath the ke'arah, labeled Kohein, Levi and Yisroel, make the ke'arah even more authentic. Your students will take pride in bringing their very own ke'arah to the seder table!

What to Download:

Goals/Objectives:

Students will be familiar with the parts of the ke'arah. Students will be involved in the seder.

Materials Needed:

- Cardstock
- Crayons or Markers and/or paint
- Scissors
- Laminator
- Velcro
- Stapler

Instructions:

- Print all five pages on cardstock. Please note that the last page may be used for two students.
- 2. Instruct students to color the page with the ke'arah and the individual pictures for the ke'arah.
- 3. Decorate the three middle pages to look like matzos. Use paint, markers, or crayons your choice!
- 4. Cut out the complete ke'arah, the matzah circles, and the individual pictures.
- 5. Laminate all of the pieces.

- 6. Attach Velcro to the backs of the small pictures, and put the corresponding halves on the matching picture on the complete seder plate.
- 7. Staple the seder plate together with the three matzos, the tabs for Kohein, Levi, and Yisroel should be layered (students lift up the tabs to see those underneath).
- 8. Remind your students to use their very own ke'aros at the seder!
